Words of Welcome and First Hymn

Prayer of Preparation

Every week, as we worship together, we have the opportunity to admit to ourselves, to each other, and to God that we do not always live as we are called. The act of confessing our sin is not simply a recitation of our faults and wrongs, but also an opportunity to receive God's mercy and share in that abundant grace. When we offer God our confession, we join the beautiful work of reconciliation, which begins with our reconciling with God.

**All: Almighty God,
to whom all hearts are open,
all desires known,
and from whom no secrets are hidden:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts
by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love you,
and worthily magnify your holy name;
through Christ our Lord.
Amen.**

Prayers of Penitence

Please sit or kneel

The Summary of the Law may be read here

Our Lord Jesus Christ said: The first commandment is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.'

The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

There is no other commandment greater than these.

On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

All: Amen. Lord, have mercy.

Invitation to confession

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven and to bring us to eternal life. Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

**All: Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
We have sinned against you and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us, forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life
to the glory of your name,
Amen.**

Or

My brothers and sisters as we prepare to celebrate the presence of Christ in word and sacrament.

Let us call to mind and confess our sins:

**All: Most merciful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought, word and deed.
We have not loved you with our whole heart.
We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.**

**In your mercy forgive what we have been,
help us to amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly,
love mercy and walk humbly with you, our God,
Amen.**

Or

Come, let us return to the Lord and say:

**All: Lord our God,
in our sin we have avoided your call.
Our love for you is like a morning cloud,
like the dew that goes away early.
Have mercy on us; deliver us from judgement;
bind up our wounds and revive us;
in Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.**

*This is an ancient hymn of praise, a reminder of the angels who sang at
Jesus' birth and our thankfulness on receiving God's forgiveness and grace.*

**All: Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
You are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father,
Amen.**

The Collect for the Day

*A prayer which varies each week it 'collects' our thoughts and prayers and affirms our faith in God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. At the conclusion of the prayer we say together: **Amen.***

The Liturgy of the Word

There are usually two readings one from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament. These readings are printed on the weekly pew sheet for you to follow or you may like to bring your own Bible to follow the readings. A psalm may be said in between the readings.

Readings

At the end of each reading the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

The Gradual Hymn

Gospel Reading

We stand to listen to the Gospel and we turn to face the Gospel reader as a mark of respect if we are able to do so.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

And at the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

Acclamation of Faith

Please stand

All are invited to participate in proclaiming together what we, as those learning to follow Jesus, believe in.

The Nicene Creed

**All: We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and was made man.**

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again

the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Jesus tells us we are all part of the same family and that before we offer our gifts, we should be at peace with each other.

Christ is our peace.

He has reconciled us to God
in one body by the cross.

We meet in his name and share his peace.

Or

We are all one in Christ Jesus.
We belong to him through faith,
heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

Or

God is love
and those who live in love live in God
and God lives in them.

Or

Where two or three are gathered together in my name,'
says the Lord, 'there am I in the midst of them.'

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We are invited to shake hands, wave or use the BSL sign for 'peace' saying to each other 'The peace of Christ be with you' or the reply 'And also with you'. Please be aware of and respect those who may be social-distancing.

Offertory Hymn

During this hymn, the bread and wine and offertory collection are brought to the altar. Our giving enables worship to continue in this place and allows us to serve our local community.

Preparation of the Table

Remain standing

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power,
the glory, the splendour and the majesty;
for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

**All: All things come from you
and of your own do we give you.**

Or

Wise and gracious God, you spread a table before us;
nourish your people with the word of life
and the bread of heaven.

All: Amen.

Or

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this bread to set before you,
which earth has given and human hands have made.
It will become for us the bread of life.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this wine to set before you,

It will become for us the cup of salvation.

As the grain once scattered in the fields and the grapes once dispersed on the hillside are now reunited on this table in bread and wine, so, Lord, may your whole Church soon be gathered together from the corners of the earth into your kingdom.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Please remain standing

These are the great prayers of thanksgiving, each prayer has echoes of the stories and images in the Bible and from ancient liturgies. The opening responses are some of the oldest parts of Christian worship. The first part of the prayer praises God as our Creator, Redeemer and Lord of our lives. The second part follows the events of the Last Supper. The third part asks for guidance, strength and the Holy Spirit in our lives, and we offer ourselves to God's service.

Prayer A

The Lord be with you or The Lord is here

All: and also with you. **His Spirit is with us**

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy,
at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise,
holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God,
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

For he is your living Word;
through him you have created all things from the beginning,
and formed us in your own image.

Through him you have freed us from the slavery of sin,
giving him to be born of a woman and to die upon the cross;
you raised him from the dead
and exalted him to your right hand on high.

Through him you have sent upon us
your holy and life-giving Spirit,
and made us a people for your own possession.

Therefore with angels and archangels,
and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and singing/saying:

**All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Accept our praises, heavenly Father,
through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ,
and as we follow his example and obey his command,
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father,
we remember his offering of himself
made once for all upon the cross;
we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;
we look for the coming of your kingdom,
and with this bread and this cup
we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.**

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friend's
he took bread, and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to them, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

**All: Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his body is the bread of life.**

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,
he gave you thanks, and said:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins;
do this in remembrance of me.

**All: Father, we do this in remembrance of him:
his blood is shed for all.**

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory,
send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine
may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

**All: As we eat and drink these holy gifts
make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.**

With your whole Church throughout the world
we offer you this sacrifice of praise
and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

**All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us

All: Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;

Breaking of the Bread

Jesus broke bread for his friends at the Last Supper and this bread is broken for us to share in the same way

We break this bread
to share in the body of Christ.

All: Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.

Or

Every time we eat this bread
and drink this cup,

All: we proclaim the Lord's death
until he comes.

Or

The Agnus Dei may be used for the breaking of the bread
When John the Baptist met Jesus he called him the Lamb of God and in
this prayer we address Jesus by the same title.

**All: Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world,
grant us peace.**

Or

**Jesus, Lamb of God,
have mercy on us.
Jesus, bearer of our sins,
have mercy on us.
Jesus, redeemer of the world,
grant us peace.**

Giving of Communion

The consecrated bread and wine are offered and all are invited to receive either in both kinds - bread and wine, or the one kind. If you are able to come up to the altar to receive you may prefer to remain standing or you may kneel. If you are unable to use the steps please remain in your place or come to the front of the pulpit and we will come to you. If you'd prefer a prayer of blessing please keep your hands behind your back to indicate this.

Draw near with faith.
Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ
which he gave for you,
and his blood which he shed for you.
Eat and drink
in remembrance that he died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts
by faith with thanksgiving.

Or

Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**All: Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

Or

God's holy gifts
for God's holy people.

**All: Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.**

Or

Come to this table not because you are strong
but because you are weak.

Come, not because of any goodness of your own
but because you need mercy and help.

Come, because you love the Lord a little and would like to love
him more.

Come, because he loves you and gave himself for you.

The following Prayer of Preparation may be used:

**All: We do not presume
to come to this your table, merciful Lord,
trusting in our own righteousness,
but in your manifold and great mercies.
We are not worthy so much as to gather up the
crumbs under your table.
But you are the same Lord
whose nature is always to have mercy.
Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,
so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ
and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be
made clean by his body and our souls washed through
his most precious blood and that we may evermore
dwell in him, and he in us.
Amen.**

*The president and people receive communion, the priest may use the wording:
'The body of Christ/The blood of Christ'
we respond: **Amen.***

Prayer after Communion
