We provide specialist support that empowers young people to make positive changes and rediscover their hope.

They want a future they can look forward to and we're here to make sure they get it.

Working alongside young people, their families and community, we will not rest until together, step-by-step, we've created a society built for all children.

Young people come to us when they have low self-esteem. Refugee and migrant children land in this country alone and look to us for guidance to achieve the life they dreamed of. We see teenagers in our services who want to quit using drugs or alcohol. Who are looking after mum, dad, or their siblings more than they bargained for. Or who have been taken advantage of. Often, the hope inside all of these children has been diminished, it might only be hanging by a thread. It's our job to support and give them back, their hope.

Every year, St Paul's supports The Children's Society at the annual Christingle service at 5pm on Christmas Eve. We give a Christingle bag to up to 200 children, and during the Service, we build our Christingles. We hope to see you here!


St Paul's Community Choir

Forest Church Fantastic Plastic? In the Pacific Ocean there is a vast island, an artificial network of reefs composed of plastic refuse - bags, bottles, plastic fragments, toys - that humans have chucked into watercourses and the sea. Our lives are full of plastic - but where will it all go? I made the fantastic plastic Christmas tree out of plastic toys that deluged our home starting from when our children were little. Apart from the tree itself, none of these toys were chosen. They came in Christmas crackers, as freebies with sweets, or as promotions. Look carefully and you might guess the retailers. Some of these I love and didn't want to part with, some I find irritating. There is even a jolly plastic rubbish bin.

All this plastic is with us forever. It might fragment into microplastics and enter the food chain, but it won't go away and it will outlive me and my children by thousands of years.

In the future, these cute plastic toys could end up causing water pollution or being consumed by plankton and fish and cause untold environmental effects for thousands of years.

So, the challenge of the Fantastic Plastic tree is: can we rethink our relationship with plastic? Can we make sure plastic is used wisely? Can we say no to unnecessary plastic? Can we seek out alternatives?

And looking to the future, are there imaginative ways to craft new toys and games out of the plastic inhabitants of toy-boxes and the "freebies" that would otherwise be discarded?
