We provide specialist support that empowers young people to make positive changes and rediscover their hope.

They want a future they can look forward to and we're here to make sure they get it.

Working alongside young people, their families and community, we will not rest until together, step-by-step, we've created a society built for all children.

Young people come to us when they have low self-esteem. Refugee and migrant children land in this country alone and look to us for guidance to achieve the life they dreamed of.

We see teenagers in our services who want to quit using drugs or alcohol. Who are looking after mum, dad, or their siblings more



than they bargained for. Or who have been taken advantage of. Often, the hope inside all of these children has been diminished, it might only be hanging by a thread. It's our job to support and give them back, their hope.

Every year, St Paul's supports The Children's Society at the annual Christingle service at 5pm on Christmas Eve. We give a Christingle bag to up to 200 children, and during the Service, we build our Christingles. We hope to see you here!



St Paul's is one of several local churches that have pledged to support Christians Against Poverty in this area.
