From the Vicar.....

Dear Friends,

How do you like birthdays? Do you try and forget when yours is, or do you have a big celebration every year? Do you like presents, or would you rather have experiences?

This month Christians celebrate the birthday of the church. It's celebrated fifty days after Easter, which of course means it moves around and this year that puts it on the 8th June.

Some folks refer to it as Whit Sunday also known as Pentecost and we particularly remember the story in the book of Acts in the bible, when the Holy Spirit was given to the followers of Jesus: 'And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.' Acts 2 verses 2-4.

It's the moment from which a confused, frightened group of people with a little hope changed into an inspired, energised group of people who had the confidence and courage to go and tell the world that they had found something wonderful.

Birthdays can be a time for reevaluating, looking back and planning forwards. How have you changed for better and worse in the years you have been on the planet, what do you want to achieve in the future? It could be said of the church that it (we) need to do the same — its history since those heady early days has not been completely wrapped in glory let's face it.

So whether you are a part of a church or not, it's good to take stock and work out where next - for yourself, your family, an organisation you are part of. To look back at the places where we have not taken care of ourselves or others; where we have not been that nice, or thoughtful; where we have allowed ourselves to become lazy and self-serving and out of condition. Christians can ask for the gift of the Holy Spirit to feel real and vital and to help us change and move forward in hope and courage and energy like those first Christians. The Spirit hasn't gone away, but just like with our bodies, we don't always listen to or take her advice - and it shows!

Perhaps the beginning of summer is a good time in the year to take stock of ourselves and the things we belong to –

better weather, the abundance of nature around us and longer days somehow make us feel that new things are possible. So if you decide to begin a new healthier eating regime, or to take up a pastime that will enrich you, or some exercise, or if you think it's time repair a relationship or to try something new or different I wish you every success. And if June is your birthday month too I wish you a very Happy Birthday!


What will happen to my house Lord, Now that the rain is falling, Now that the floods are rising, Now that the wind is blowing And beating, beating upon it?

Reflecting Faith: An Offer You Do Not Want to Refuse

For the last couple of months, we've been thinking about baptism, and last time we finished by saying that, even as late as the tenth century, only baptised people could stay in the church to watch, never mind actually consume, the celebration of the Eucharist.

This tells me how highly regarded the consecration of the bread and wine actually were, and still are, within the Church. Even today this is still the 'highlight' of the main Sunday service.

Everything we do within the service leads up to this special moment, when the priest offers the bread and wine to the people.


Prior to this, we've said prayers of penitence and have been absolved. We have heard stories from the Bible and had them expanded upon in a sermon.

We have stated our faith in response to this, and recognised God's awesome power by saying prayers of intercession for ourselves and others. We have acknowledged God's amazing gifts of love and peace by sharing this with those around us, and we responded by offering to Him our gifts as token of our whole lives.

And then – finally we get to the Eucharistic Prayer.

As soon as this is concluded and the priest invites the congregation to come forward to receive the consecrated bread and wine, we are 'so overwhelmed' by the enormity of what

is being offered to each of us that we 'fall on our knees' with the Prodigal Son and say, "Lord I am not worthy'.



This month: When you next go to a Communion Service, take note of the pattern of it as a whole and then 'think' about how you feel as you are invited to take the bread and wine.

Ordination season is underway

Every summer the CofE ordains its new deacons and priests.

The services are traditionally held during Petertide (29th June), a feast day that remembers the martyrdom of Saint Peter. He was the fisherman who became a devoted disciple of Jesus, and who then went on to be an instrumental figure in the early Church in Jerusalem.


Although the ordinations this summer will be held in a variety of cathedrals across the country, those being ordained will have certain important things in common:

- They will have felt called by God to serve as a deacon or priest.
- They will have passed a rigorous selection process.
- They will have completed a twoto-three-year training course (diploma or degree) at one the of theological education institutes (TEIs) based around the country.

And so here they are now – called, accepted, trained and soon to be set apart for this s p e c i a l i s e d ministry. If you know a deacon or a priest, pray for them and their families the



families this month, as they begin a lifetime of public service to God.
